## BILL G<sup>8</sup>.

## An Act for the relief of Hazel Emily Louise Hunter Naud.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Hazel Emily Louise Hunter Naud, residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, advertising clerk, wife of Frank Ivanhoe Joseph Naud, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the said city, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the fifteenth 5 day of July, A.D. 1950, at the said city, she then being Hazel Emily Louise Hunter, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence 10 adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Hazel Emily Louise 15 Hunter and Frank Ivanhoe Joseph Naud, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again. 2. The said Hazel Emily Louise Hunter may at any time hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully 20 marry if the said marriage with the said Frank Ivanhoe Joseph Naud had not been solemnized.
