which those Colonies were founded, be act cording to the best Ideas of Policy, it is not my Business to inquire; but it may be thought a little hard, that a Ministry of this Day, should bear the Blame of an ill-judged Scheme, contrived and executed an hundred Years before they were born.

6 2 1 1 1 1 2 2 3 3 3 . 3 . 3 . 1 . 1 BILL MIL : These Inconveniences, in the Constitution of the Colonies (for fuch they are at least with Respect to the present Object) which the prefent Ministry neither caused, nor could eafily redrefs, begin already to be less felt, and less to impede the Defigns which are carrying on for their common Prefervation. What no Wildom perhaps could have done, the Miferics felt by many, and apprehended by them all, has at length effected. Thele, have taught them the Neceffity of laying ande their Disputes amongst themselves, their Jealoufies of their Neighbours, and their obstinate religious Prejudices, in favour of the common Safety. Co-operating with the beginning of this happy Difpolition; the Ministry has fent over a General of Reputation and Rank; feveral excellent Officers under him, and a Body of regular Troops to Arengthen and bring into Form the irregular Forces raifed in that Country.

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
