

II.

That the Principal Preceptor do not hold any Church Preferment, nor engage in any Clerical Function, which may in the opinion of the Council interfere with his Scholastic duties.

III.

That it be his Office to instruct his Pupils with strict Grammatical precision in such branches of Classical learning as may be required of Candidates for Matriculation; and to avail himself of the assistance of the English Master in his Department.

IV.

That it be the duty of the English Master to teach the pupils under his charge Reading, Writing, the rudiments of English Grammar, Geography and History, together with Arithmetic, Practical Geometry and Book keeping; and also to instruct the Classical Pupils in such of the foregoing branches and at such of the School hours as the Principal Preceptor shall consider necessary.
