Boy of Fourteen Found Dead in Kitchen at Chicago Under Mysterious Circumstances.

Chicago, Jan. 2.-Earl Dean, 14 years old, was found dead in the kitchen of his mother's flat in Hyde Park last night. The boy's head and shoulders rested on a pillow in the oven of a gas range, with the unlighted gas escaping from the burners under it. His hands were tied behind him and his feet were

were tied behind him and his feet were bound with one of his mother's aprons. A handkerchief was knotted loosely about his neck.

The fact that the youth was bound and that the back door of the flat, in which he was alone, was unlocked, gave rise to a strong suspicion of murder. Nothing in the rooms, however, had been touched. Furthermore, the placing of the cushion beneath the lad's head was taken as evidence of preparation for taking his own life, a precaution that no murderer would have taken.

Young Dean lived alone with his mother. Mrs. Mary Dean; whose chief support he was.
