REMARKABLE EXHIBITION

Dr. Dixon Lectures on the Poetry of Picture Making and Shows Queen's Kodak Work.

An exhibition of remarkable photographs, enlarged to the size of ordinary paintings, was opened last night in Massey Hall, which was thronged with lovers of the photographic art. Dr. Joseph K. Dixon, B.A., gave a

lecture, with the aid of lantern slides, on the "Poetry of Photography." The doctor explained the romance of photography as being able to carry away with you things which it would be impossible to describe in a diary.

Antiquities. Without a single technical phrase, Dr. Dixon showed the fascination of photography as a delightful, intellectual and moral stimulus. His discourse ran from grave to gay and covered about 200 studies—without doubt the best slides ever shown in Toronto. One of the most interesting of the screens in the exhibition of enlarged photographs, which completely bound the main auditorium of the large mall, Rev. It is argued that the clause passed by the senate as part of the bill incorporating Col. Gibson's Hamilton Electric Merger Co., is entirely ultra vires, and the and bylaws of municipalities with provincial companies an impossible one. It will be remembered that Col.
