Some time ago Dr. Machell resigned from the Board of the Ontario Medical College and subsequently an election was held to all the vacancy, the polls closing at 2 b'clock on Tuesday last. Protect Canadian Trade. A circular was received by the secretary of the Toronto Board of Trade yesterday, from the secretary of the British Columbia Board, which reads:
"The Chambers of Commerce of San Francisco, Portland, Seattle and Tacoma have combined to force the closing of Dyea as a port of entry, to divert the Klondike trade from Canada to the United States, in the meantime, a miner is charged 86 per day on outfit between Lynn Canal and Tagish Lake, in the disputed country. Owing to the time taken during the present season, this amounts to over 50 per cent. on outfit. This is fatal to Canadian trade, unless the American Government makes reasonable regulations. Canada can only secure the Klondike trade by closing all customs ports except Glenora and Fort Cudhy, Your active support is hereto required."


