

MINES AND MINING STOCKS.

Good Ore From a Lake-of-the-Woods Property.

Victory-Triumph Reported to Be About Ready to Ship to the Smelters—War Eagle Still Advancing—Other Mining Shares Notes.

Regarding a Lake of the Woods gold mining property, in which a number of Toronto people are interested, The Toronto Mining of the 24th inst. has this to say: The Cameron Island gold mine is showing up in great shape. Recently 17 assays of ore taken from 10 to 145 feet below the surface have shown an average value of \$14.11 free-milling gold to the ton. Considering the fact that this ore is from a 20-foot vein, the showing is very remarkable. In addition to this big vein there are eight others, and among them can be worked from one shaft, an immense ore body that will keep a 40-stamp mill busy for years. The shaft is now 110 feet deep on the 60-foot level. When the present shaft is down to 110 feet level there will then be 22,138 tons of ore at \$14.11 per ton at lowest calculation, which will supply 100 tons of ore for 221 years to the capacity of a 40-stamp mill. While that ore is being mined new ground could be opened, and thus the mill would be kept busy day and night for years to come. The ore can be milled and mined for \$1.50 per ton, so it will be seen that the Cameron Island people have evidence of a fortune in their grasp. A compressor plant for 10 or 15 drills is now being talked of for the mine. The satisfactory development work causes Mr. J. J. Foster of Toronto and Superintendent William Caldwell to be particularly happy—and they have a right to rejoice over the bright prospects of the mine.

IN CONDITION TO SHIP.

Victory-Triumph Will Soon Join the List of Ore Producers.

On the Victory-Triumph operations have begun to open up the Triumph last vein. This vein, of which the croppings have always returned very high gold values, has now been stripped for over 200 feet, and some very fine ore is being taken out. A shaft will be started as soon as the most favorable point on the vein is determined. The Victory-Triumph mine is now in a position to ship ore steadily by rail before the snow falls, and to ship more ore during the winter months to put the mine on a paying basis, and provide for the treatment of the vast reserves of concentrating ore already blocked out in the mine. A complete report of the Victory-Triumph operations is in hand, and will be presented to the shareholders shortly. A bid demand is springing up for Victory-Triumph shares. All the cheap stock offered with in the last three months has been quickly picked up.—*Investing Stocks.*

War Eagle yesterday was quoted on the Mining Exchange at 270 asked and 262 bid. In the afternoon it sold at 273 on the Toronto Stock Exchange, and closed at 275, asked on the Montreal board. On the Mining Exchange Deer Park and White Bear were active. Hammond Reef was stronger, and closed at 18 bid. Saw Bill was quoted at 42 bid. Smuggler also was in good demand, and closed at 39 bid. 15 asked. Golden Eagle is in demand at 43, sellers are asking 40 cents. Big Three advanced to 10 cents; 9 1/2 was paid for 2000 shares. Deer Park sold from 17 to 17 1/2, and closed at 18 asked. Montreal real Deer Mountain was in demand, but hardly any can be obtained. Monte Cristo sold from 31 to 32, and closed at 31 bid. White Bear sold at 8 cents, and is in good demand at that figure; closing quotations were 8 1/2 asked and 7 1/2 bid. Some sold as high as 8 1/2. Five thousand of Victory-Triumph sold for 9.
