Death of a Dufferin Pioneer. Orangeville, Feb. 28.—Last night George Robinson died at the residence of his son, Thomas J. Robinson, of this town, at the age of 77 years. The deceased was a pioneer of Dufferin, having settled in this county about 50 years ago. He removed from East Garafraxa to Orangeville in 1838, and engaged extensively in the purchase and shipment of live stock. He was well known to cattle men all over Canada.
