REGINALD KENNEDY DEAD.
One of the Pioneers of Hamilton Journalism Passed Away Monday Evening.
SUSTAINED FALL TEN DAYS AGO
Deceased Was 66 Years of Age and Leaves a Wife and One Daughter.

REGINALD KENNEDY, president and general manager of The Times Printing Company, passed away in The Times ward at the General Hospital at 9.45 this evening. His death was not unexpected, he having been low for two or three days. About ten days ago he sustained a fall from a balcony on a banana skin and his head was severely cut. He suffered from heart trouble and shock and was taken to the hospital last Thursday.

INFANT'S MYSTERIOUS DEATH.
Inquest Will Be Held To-Night To Determine Its Cause.
Coroner Young has issued a warrant for an inquest to-night concerning the death of an infant child of Lena Johnson, a 17-year-old girl who was employed at a downtown hotel, where she gave birth to the infant at 9 o'clock on Sunday evening. Her condition was discovered until 8 o'clock Sunday night, when Lenix Whelan, a friend of Miss Johnson's, called in Dr. McCullough, Jr., of Spadina-avenue, who, on his arrival, found the child was dead. A post-mortem examination to determine the cause of the infant's death is being held by Drs. McCullough and Harrington.
