ENGLAND TODAY WARNS SMOKERS EXPLORERS GET

Government Weathers As- OF DECENT USAGE saults on Policy, But People Groan Under Taxation.

LONDON, Jan, 3.—What promised to be the most formidable attack yet made on the Government's financial policy has collapsed, and the coalition is breathing more freely. In spite of many prophecies of disaster, Mr. Lloyd George's Government has weathered all the storms of the year and will enter 1921 with no unusually dark clouds on the horizon. the horizon.

Last spring the chancellor of the exchequer, Austen Chamberlain, estimated that the expenses for the current year would amount to £1,418,300,000, including £234,198,000 to be applied to reduction of the national debt. Later he estimated that the expenses in a normal year would be £808,000,000; but he added that next year would not be a normal year, and he could not tell when the normal year would arrive. Subsequently he increased the 'normal year" estimater by several million pounds. More than

Berlin, Jan. 3. — Herr Willie von Urruh, a Leipzig engineer, lately fluttered the German scientific dovecots as they had not been fluttered since the finding of radium. ### SAYS REDMOND AND **DILLON SAVED CARSON** FROM PROSECUTION

Masterman Says Irish Nationalists Persuaded the

Cabinet To Desist. MACCLESFIELD, Eng., Jan. 3.—The Irish Nationalist leaders, John Dillon and John Redmond, saved Sir Edward Carson, Unionist advocate, from prosecution for preaching rebellion in Ulster in 1914, says Charles F. Mr. Masterman in addressing an audience here blamed Sir Edward for beginning the resistance to the crown which led up to the present situation in Ireland. One of his hearers asked why the Ulster leader was not then prosecuted and Mr. Masterman replied:

'The cabinet was ready to do so, but John Redmond and John Dillon, acting through Mr. Lloyd George, persuaded the cabinet not to take the step. They argued that in three months' time the Home Rule Bill would become law, and they would then be responsible for the government of Ireland. They asked that they should be allowed to undertake the government of Ireland without being hampered by any feeling created beforehand by the prosecution of Sir Edward Carson.
