

This ground is now cut from under the provision in the Payne bill that no British colony shall be defined as a preference if it may make in its tariff to England or to any of its sister colonies. The offer of minimum duties in coal in shape never contemplated by Sir Wilfrid Laurier and the Ottawa politicians. The Laurier government have failed since 1893 to give an understanding between the manufacturers of Ontario and Quebec for the coal interests of the Dominion. The tariff commission of 1905-6, manufacturers were asked concerning the duty of 33 cents on coal. Sir Wilfrid Laurier's answer was that he had nothing to say on this aspect of the protective tariff. Canadians have paid the duty of three or four mining companies, operating in Cape Breton on the mainland of Nova Scotia or in the coal fields of the Dominion. Originally, the purpose of the Payne bill was to give the Dominion a coal trade of its own, but the Laurier government has failed to do this. The Laurier government has failed to do this.
