BLACK HAND IN MONTREAL

But Italians Call It Nonsense, That There Are Signs.

Montreal, Sept. 4.—(Special.)—Montreal is exercised over the so-called Black Hand of the Italian Mafia. Yesterday some one pasted a picture of a coffin and skull bones in Signor Cordesca's window, St. James-street, hence all the commotion. The idea that there are now building up secret societies for promoting crime, this continent among Italians? J. M. Vigliani, the interpreter of the criminal courts, was asked.

"I do not believe there is any such condition as the New York people seem to think exists. There is a large amount of individual bluff about this thing. It helps scamps to carry out schemes of blackmail to hint or threaten that they have a powerful secret society behind them. The thing appeals to the melodrama in people's minds. There is a lot of clear nonsense being talked about such things. Criminals should be treated as criminals, no matter to what country they claim to owe allegiance."

"Have you any knowledge of such parties in Canada? The man who shot the boy in New York is claimed to have come from Canada."

"I did hear of a man who answered the description of the man under arrest in New York having been in Montreal with another man. He was a stranger to the Italian colony here. We have with us all kinds of Italians, but for the most part they are quiet, inoffensive workmen, who go out and do a job of honest work when they can get it. They speak many different dialects, but there are very few in Montreal who speak really pure Italian."

"Have you ever heard about men of the 'Black Hand' in Canada?"

"Yes, and have laughed at it, as I do now. I have heard of instances where people were told to hand out money or they would incur the enmity of the Mafia or something like that—right here in Montreal, too. But it was all nonsense."

CHURCH IN CANADA SEEN MAY INFLUENCE CANTERBURY

Canon Cody on the Significance and Possibilities of Archbishop's Visit.

At the conclusion of his morning sermon in St. Paul's Church, Rev. J. C. Cody made a graceful reference to the archbishop's visit. It was an epoch-making event, he said, when the first subject in the British empire crossed the seas and visited a part of the colonial dominions.

Despite the tendency of the day to regard the man himself rather than the office he held in it, the glories and associations of past years.

The office stood for us as the emblem of the mother church of England, to which we in Canada owed so much.

"The we were now autonomous in our church government and owed no allegiance to the mother church, and the mistress in our own house, yet we gladly recognized that we were daughters in the house of the old mother church."

Canon Cody alluded to a most important issue that might be expected to arise from the visit.

The archbishop would see with his own eyes the spectacle of great self-governing churches of his own communion organized in synods in which the laity bore as active and important a part as did the clergy. In England, where no such power was vested in the laity, the archbishop was being given an opportunity to inspect the working of the system, which might bear future fruit.

As to the primacy of the character, Dr. Cody described him as a wise, cautious, courtly and liberal-minded man, as witness his offer to arbitrate in the dispute between the Anglican and Roman churches, and in his furtherance of great philanthropic and missionary movements. As to the significance of the visit it was in a sense the consummation of the colonial expansion of the visit in the year 1873, when, as Chas. Inglis, formerly rector of Trinity Church, New Brunswick, once said, the first of the world's great churches was also shown a recognition by the mother church of the wider world that was springing up across the seas.
