year have been supplied them 4th - The above remarks apply with equal force to the complants of albert Flett Councillor of the Cumberland Band of Indians 5th The Complaints of "other Indians living in the same quarter," if they ever made such complaints are the verest rubbish, for Indian agent ma Kay never look out any seed to them, and consequently he could not throw it on the shore te, as represented. The Seed Polaloes were furnished last spring to the Saskatehewan River Indians of Treaty 10. 5, by hr Belanger, Hudson's Bay Officer at bumberland, as I found it impossible to forward polatoes from here in time for planting, and as the expense of transportation would be upwards of y dollars per bushel, I suggested to your Department the advisability of purchasing at the Reserves when Potatoes te could be had for seed.
