hammers, &c., we have a total expenditure, directly and indirectly on stone-breaking, of \$2,905.41. The quantity of broken stone sold was fifty-two thousand seven hundred and thirty-six bushels, at five cents a bushel.

The Central Board regret that it has not been found practicable during the year to make suitable arrangements for the employment of indigent females to any greater extent than formerly.

The gratuitous relief afforded was chiefly dispensed in the months of January, February and March. Summing up the monthly returns of the visitors (in which the repetition of the same names of course occurs), we find an enumeration as of seven hundred and one families, comprising nineteen hundred and sixty-three persons relieved in the above months, when the following quantities of provisions were supplied :-
