MILES WILL RACE AT SYDNEY SEPT. 29

SYDNEY, N. S., Sept. 17—John C. Miles, the Sydney Mines marathon king, will run an invitation 10-mile race against the leading runners of Eastern Canada at Ashby track here September 29. A. D. Campbell announced at noon today.

Those invited to race are Jimmy Hawthold, Westville; Reg. O'Toole, Newfoundland runner; McDonald of Baddeck, and Reid Ross of Sydney. Miles' ambition is to lower the ten-mile local track record of 65 minutes, 29 seconds, set by Whitey Michelson a few weeks ago. Mr. Campbell states that all arrangements for the event have been completed.
