3 CHAMPIONS IN ONE SAINT JOHN FAMILY GROUP

Fred Logan and His Boys Outstanding Figures in Skating World.

EACH HAS WON HIGH HONORS IN GAME

Fine Work of "Dad" Against Best of His Day on Circuit.

Three champion skaters in the one family—father and two sons—is the notable record of Fred Logan of this city and his boys, Willie and Francis.

One of the prominent skaters here in the late eighties was Frank Dowd of Montreal.

He was a three mile race and Dowd won with Findlay second. The ice for not good and the time was slow.
