15-YEAR-OLD BRIDE SLAIN BY HUSBAND

Married in Italy Two Months
Ago and Brought to America—Quarrel Precedes the Killing.

New York, Nov. 16.—Two months ago a little black-eyed Italian girl of fifteen years became the bride of Dominick Sorrentino, thirty-three years old, a laborer, who had brought back a fortune of \$1,000 to his native city in Italy. This week, the child bride was shot by her husband in front of her home at 188 Union avenue, Brooklyn. She died in the Greenpoint Hospital.

The husband was arrested after a chase of five blocks, but the police were unable to solve the mystery of why he had done the shooting. The girl had been unconscious from the time she was shot till the moment of her death, and made no statement.

From what information detectives could pick up from friends and relatives of the couple, it was learned that Sorrentino had brought his wife here from Italy immediately after the marriage. There was a quarrel, and the girl went to live with her aunt at 188 Union avenue, while the husband went to lodgings at 41 Havenmeyer street.

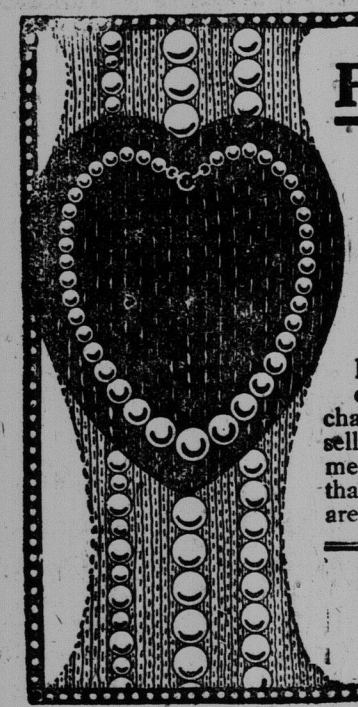
A quarrel in which the husband begged his bride to make a home for him is believed to have preceded the shooting. They had been talking on the sidewalk in front of her aunt's home, when the girl made a movement as if to go into the house. Then the man drew a pistol and fired three times, hitting his wife in the left breast, left forearm, and left hand.

Sorrentino started to run, but the shots had been heard by Patrolmen Garvey and Stevens, who chased him. After he had led them five blocks, they caught up with him and put him under arrest. According to the police, he still had the pistol with three exploded cartridges in his possession, and admitted the shooting. He will be arraigned in the Williamsburg police court on a charge of homicide.

WOMAN WAS SHOT BY "GOOD-KILLERS"

Refused to Pay Blackmail—
Seven Bullets in Body.

Pittsburgh, Pa., Nov. 16.—Holding her five-year-old daughter, Mrs. Catherine Cardon, forty-two, sat in her home in Page street, McKees Rocks, when a crash of revolver shots shattered the window near her and she slipped to the floor dead, still clasping the child, who died in the Ohio Valley Hospital today. Seven bullets entered the mother's body.

A telegram was received by Hon. Dr. W. F. Roberts last evening to the effect that the Hon. David I. Robinson, of Gloucester (Mass.), had passed away yesterday morning at his home in Mount Pleasant avenue, Gloucester. The late Mr. Robinson was a gentleman of outstanding character and sterling worth. He was beloved by all whose good fortune it was to have known him. His name was a household word throughout the Temple of Honor world, he having been an active member of this organization for more than fifty years and upon two occasions occupied the chair of supreme templar. 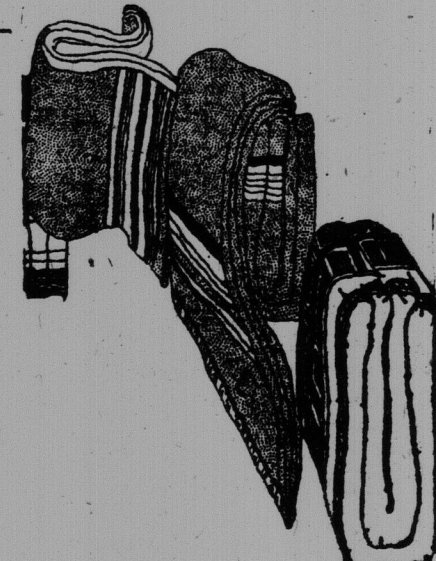

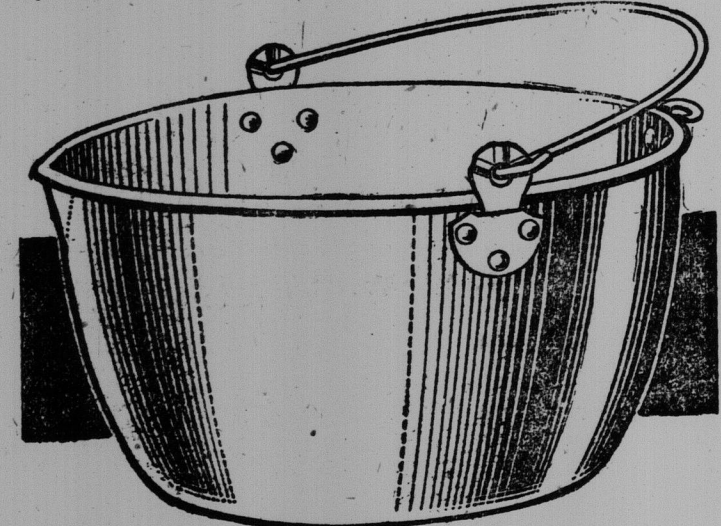
