BIDDING FAREWELL TO POPULAR PASTOR

The congregation of St. David's church will take leave of its minister, Rev. J. A. MacKeigan, and Mrs. MacKeigan with deep regret and at the close of the pre-communion service last night there was presented to both the minister and his wife a tangible token of the congregation's real appreciation and an address which expressed that appreciation feelingly. The clerk of the session, B. R. Jack, presented a check for several hundred dollars to Mr. MacKeigan on behalf of the men of the congregation and read the address. Mrs. D. R. Willet, on behalf of the women of the congregation, presented to Mr. MacKeigan a handsome head chalice bag which contained a substantial amount in gold. The gifts were gratefully acknowledged by Mr. MacKeigan in short speech and he was evidently much touched by the expressions of good will and by the kind thought of his people. Mr. MacKeigan will preach his farewell sermon in St. David's church on Sunday and leaves next week for his new charge in Moose Jaw. Mrs. MacKeigan will follow him early in the autumn.

ONTARIO TO GET \$3,000,000 BY EATON'S WILL

Toronto, June 9.—The will of Sir John Eaton, late president of the T. Eaton Co., Ltd., disposed of an estate of \$18,095,622.23 including interest of \$4,809,845 in the T. Eaton Co., 156 shares of Dominion Bank stocks, \$30,942; 250 shares of C. P. R., \$30,000; shares in T. Eaton Life Assurance Co., \$60,000; shares in T. Eaton Drug Co., \$60,000; and other holdings in clubs, charitable organizations and institutions making a total of \$4,978,837 in stocks. Bonds include Dominion War, \$284,877.88; Province of Ontario bonds, and stocks, \$1,074,701.83; miscellaneous \$88,186.75; a total of \$4,949,664.80. Bank deposits and promissory notes are \$36,104,001; real estate mortgages \$22,060,861; miscellaneous assets \$190,876; real estate of \$3,229,157 (including the Toronto residence "Ardwold" \$300,000). The executors are Lady Eaton, R. Y. Eaton, Harry McGee, J. J. Vaughan, and C. N. Mills. They are authorized to transfer to the Methodist church the property and lands known as "Timothy Eaton Memorial Church" in Toronto with or without terms, as deemed advisable.

Also they are to use \$800,000 for investment or in purchase of the Hamilton factory and to pay income therefrom to Sir John's brother, Major W. F. Eaton. Lady Eaton is to have the city and Muskoka homes and \$100,000 a year. Sir John's stock in the T. Eaton Co., Ltd., is to be retained by the executors until one of the children assume the management.

Mrs. Timothy Eaton is provided for as at present. Sir John's sisters are to receive payments not to exceed \$21,800 a year and the brother, Major Eaton, not to exceed \$15,000.

Bequests to members and former members of the "Ardwold" staff amount to \$99,000.

The province of Ontario will be about \$3,000,000 richer by Sir John's death, this sum being the amount of succession duties against the estate.

A HOTEL BURNED IN GLOUCESTER CO.

Bathurst, June 9.—A building formerly known as McKeown's Hotel, at Six Roads, Gloucester county, has been destroyed as well as one or more other buildings in the village near the Carleton Place, on the Carleton Railway, and is forty miles due east of Bathurst. There are large lots of settlement land in the district, and it is thought the fire originated in slash burning there.

MAGRATH NEW HEAD FOR V. O. N.

Ottawa, June 10.—C. A. Magrath, chairman of the International Joint Commission, is the new head of the Victorian Order of Nurses for Canada. He succeeds Dr. Thomas Gibson, president since 1918, who resigns on account of professional duties. Mr. Magrath's appointment was made at the annual meeting yesterday. Hon. W. A. Charlton of Toronto and A. D. Brathwaite of the Bank of Montreal, were made vice-presidents with Sir George Burn of Ottawa. The honorary secretaries are: Major W. D. Herridge and Dr. Duncan Campbell Scott; the honorary treasurers: Sir George Burn and Col. C. A. Elliott; and the honorary counsel, Dr. Charles Morse.

An afternoon round table conference was held by the new director general, Dr. Malcolm T. MacEachern, superintendent of Vancouver General Hospital, who is making a public health survey of Canada for the order.
