HOW NURSES OF SCHOOLS HELP THE CHILDREN

Ottawa System Proving so Helpful That More Nurses May Be Employed

(Ottawa Free Press.) "Many children have unclean heads," said Dr. J. H. Putman, inspector, when sked about the public school nurse in spection, which, he added, is proving sat-isfactody. Consideration will probably surses, Dr. Putman added. The present scheme is to prevent the spread of disease and stamp it out in the first stages Explains the Work

Dr. Putman went on to explain how the health of children is now a matter of supreme consideration, and in this re-spect public bodies dealing with schools must not lack ingenuity and forethought in providing the machinery of attention to the physical condition of their young

liminating to a great extent the possibility of an outbreak and spread of con In August last the management committee of the Ottawa school board fixed regulations to govern a system of school inspection by nurses and though of only recent introduction, the scheme proprises to be most satisfactory and to have

ustified its inauguration.

Dr. J. H. Putman, who is supervising the scheme, as yet has only two nurses who are engaged in the work of detecting physical defects—Misses Scott and Turnbull. Doubtless the staff of nurses will be augmented, as there are twenty schools to visit and half a day to be spent at each every week. Invaluable as the curative work of this scheme is, the preventative steps taken are even more valuable.

A very commonplace discovery in the schools here and everywhere is children with heads not any too clean, or suffering from some skin disease. In these cases, detected first by the nurse, the principal of the school sends the child home to remain there until cleanliness has been observed. The child is not sent aimlessly home, but he or she is given a namphlet, which advises med-

is given a pamphlet, which advises medical attention, and in the event of that not being procured, instructions are printed as to correct treatment of dirty heads.

A close observation is made of children's throats, teeth, hair, eyelids, hands, ears, and glands. The nurse is invested with power to bandage wounds and apply antiseptic dressings to cuts, burns, and bruises, prescribing medicines being without her jurisdiction. The medical officer of health is called upon in eases of the discovery of mumps, measles, whooping cough, scarlet fever, diphtheria, chickenpox, smallpox, and other contagious diseases. A Helpful Attitude.

This is not a work of assumption of cold authority over the children by the committee, but more of a sympathetic kindly intervention between parent and

teacher.

The nurses confer with the teachers and parents concerned in "discovered" cases and parents are encouraged to associate with the nurses at the schools in respect to their children's health. Talks on school and personal hygiene between nurses, teachers and scholars are also a feature of the scheme. Since September there have been a few contagious cases.


