Prof. McCrea of Guilford delivered a most interesting lecture on tuberculosis in the Church hall this evening.

Hon. Mr. Lablino, in introducing the speaker, announced that the government intended giving a series of lectures on agriculture through the province at an early date.

Prof. McCrea said his subject was not a new one, as four hundred years ago laws had been enacted in Europe against handling cattle affected with consumption or tuberculosis.

It is estimated that twenty per cent. of the deaths are caused by consumption in Canada no more than one-seventh of the deaths are from the same cause. He believed that Canada was free from this disease but Europe and the United States, but in some places the cattle were considerably affected.
