IN TRAIN WRECKS

Montreal, Feb. 1.—Five persons were injured, three of them probably fatally, when the New York bound Rutland express, which left Montreal this morning tore through a defective switch at L'Acadie, Que, cut its baggar car in two, and overturned the locomotive.

Fireman Wm. Marchand and engineer H. Laperial, and Mrs. Laura Leembard of Isle La Motte, were most seriously injured and several others were slightly hurt when the west-bound Canadian Pacific train No. 1 was derailed near Gleichen, filty-five miles east of here, last night. The train, travelling fast, struck a broken rail.

Newark, N. J., Feb. 1.—Trapped like rats, twelve workmen, all negroes were suffocated to death here last alast night in a caisson in the Passaic list. Shift engaged in work preparatory to last the reconstruction of the Centre street bridge between here and Harrison. It is understood that the accident was directly due to the dropping of a huge metal bucket, loaded with mud and stone. This struck the caisson on top, breaking the door thus cutting off the air and allowing the water and gravel to rush into the caisson from below.
