before reported abandoned, had been

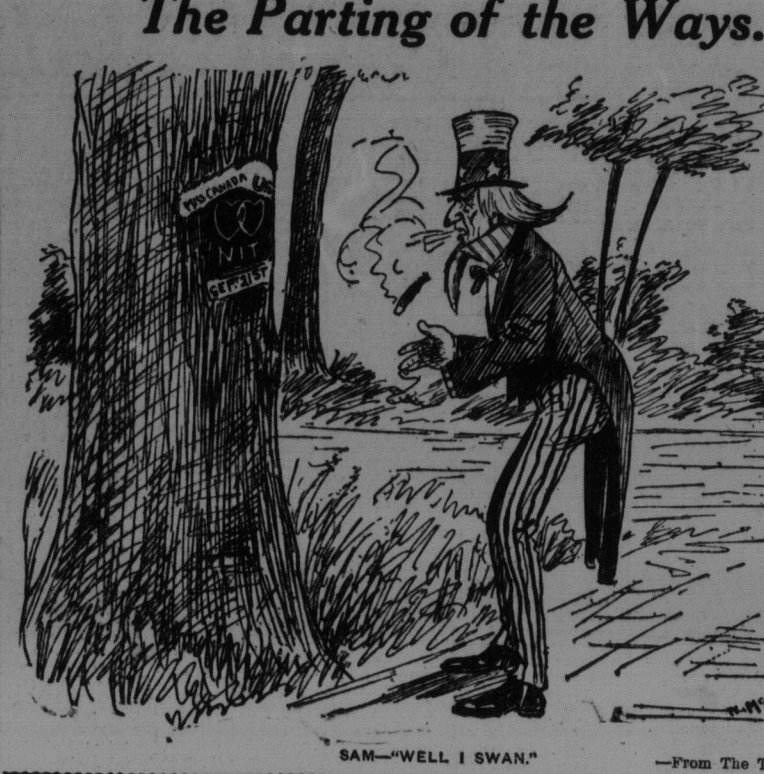
clinging for two days in the wreck be-
