COL. MACLEAN PRAISES WORK OF CANADIANS

Arrived on Olympic Yesterday and Reach This City Today to Visit Family.

Halifax, June 13.—Among the passengers on the Olympic today was Colonel C. W. W. MacLean, C. M. G., D. S. O., with two sons. He is a son of General MacLean of St. John, and is M. P. for Brig. Lincolnshire, in the British House of Commons. Col. MacLean served through the war as an officer of the Royal Horse Artillery. "No one can realize the admiration entertained in England for Canadians," said Col. MacLean. "There is no such word now as 'colonial' as applied to Canada. The Dominion is an integral part of the Empire. Once Canadians may have been children of the Empire but they are fully grown now though not forgetful of the long period of protecting care they enjoyed during all the past years. "There is no such thing as Bolshevism in England," Colonel MacLean went on to say. They have had no protracted strikes. The people see that conditions have changed and they are well adapting themselves. Full normal peace conditions are to be 15 years off, but the public are preparing and there is no doubt that Britain will come out alright. "The present government is very strong. The results of recent bye-elections signify nothing. That they should go as they have done is some work of extending the man be unseated." Col. MacLean is going to St. John. Lord Beaverbrook is to take a motor trip through Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, accompanied by W. D. Scott of Toronto. He is not in Canada, he says, for business, but for health.

Police Pickard, on information presented by the crown prosecutor, J. A. Hanway, took charge of the dapper little celestial, but subsequent developments indicated otherwise, and James Tom, familiarly known as Jimmie, was placed under arrest owing to the shooting.

FEAR OF POVERTY

CHIEF CAUSE OF LABOR UNREST

Industrial Relations Commission Holding Its Last Meeting at Ottawa—Get No Pointers.

Ottawa, June 13.—The first sitting in Ottawa and the last in its tour of the Dominion Industrial Relations Commission appointed by the government to inquire into the cause of labor unrest in Canada was held in the city hall here tonight. Evidence was heard from several representative citizens, each contributing his views as to the causes and remedies of the present unsatisfactory conditions in the economic world in Canada.

The first and principal witness heard this morning was Mr. W. M. Southern, of the Ottawa Citizen, who, after outlining a plan for the taxation of land values as an extremely important step towards the solution of social unrest, declared that the present unsatisfactory conditions and other labor reforms were but palliatives which were desirable for the present, but did not touch the root of the problem which was the holding of land in speculation instead of putting it to productive use.

Mr. Southern declared that the cause of labor unrest was the fear of poverty, and if that fear were removed the problem would be greatly simplified. He urged the commission to recommend to the Dominion government that a tax of five mills on the dollar be at once placed on the capital value of all natural resources, including land values, and that this tax be increased each year until the government's fair proportion of the country's land values are taken for federal purposes, that provincial and municipal governments be gradually shift their taxes on the other land values, and that as the revenues
