Fredericton, N. B., April 6.—Today's session of the Provincial Legislature was featured by very rank statements from Mr. Dysart, and the declaration of Hon. Mr. Tweeddale that he had been insulted by the member from St. John (Mr. Potts), who had referred to him as a butcher.
