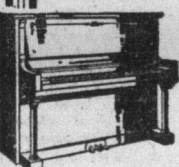

FIRE PREVENTION
J. Grove Smith, Appointed Dominion Commissioner. Ottawa Feb 25—For the purpose of assisting in the work of fire prevention the Government will retain the services of J. Grove Smith, late the Conservation Commissioner. Mr. Smith has been appointed to the staff of the Department of Insurance and will act in the capacity of Dominion

Fire Prevention Commissioner in co-operation with the Provincial Fire Commissioners and fire marshals and with the municipal authorities. This committee under the chairmanship of W.H. Shapley of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association, Toronto, adopted many other important resolutions with a view to reducing fire waste.

The committee through J.B. Laid, law, of Toronto, extended an invitation to the National Fire Protection Association of the United States and Canada to hold its forthcoming annual meeting in Ottawa. This invitation has been accepted and delegates from all over the continent will meet in Ottawa on May 6, 7 and 8.

Inquest Resumed.
The inquest into the death of the babe that recently was found in the city was resumed in the City Hall this afternoon. No new developments in the case have occurred.

Collegiate Board Estimates
The Collegiate Board at a special meeting last evening struck the estimates for the year. The sum of \$215,000, exactly \$1000 more than last year, will be required to be raised by taxation (\$1707.10 for city and \$4412.90 for Waterloo). The comparative figures for 1919 and 1918 are expenses, 1919, \$33981.54; 1918, \$31388.09; less, receipts, 1919, \$12481.54; 1918, \$10888.09; to be raised by taxation, 1919, \$21500; 1918, \$20500; (Kitchener, 1919, \$1707.10; 1918, \$1622.27; Waterloo, 1919, \$4412.90; 1918, \$4278.73).

After the striking of the estimates, Mr. C. W. Schiedel asked: "What about discussing the question of a new school, including technical and collegiate?" Chairman Hallman replied: "Well, we want to go and see the London school first, and we better leave it until after we have been there." Mr. J. A. Lang, Chairman of the Advisory Industrial Committee, said the Board would do well to also visit Brantford, where some difficulty is being experienced in coming to a decision regarding the matter.

The members present were Messrs. M. Hallman, J. A. Seelen, J. A. Lang, Bauer, C. W. Schiedel, W. H. Halliwell, J. K. Miller, Principal D. Forsyth and Secretary E. Pequegnat.

Fifty-Dollar Debentures
St. Thomas City Solicitor was instructed in a resolution passed by the Finance Committee of the City Council to seek special legislation whereby municipal debentures may be issued to the amount of \$50 in place of the \$100 minimum now in force. This action was brought about following a request from the local Trades and Labor Council which explained that \$50 bonds would enable many workmen to invest their small savings where otherwise they would be unable to.

Fall Wheat in Good Shape
Dr. C. A. Zavitz, Professor of Field Husbandry at the Ontario Agricultural College, said that so far as he could tell just now the fall wheat should be in good shape.

It had a good start last fall, the winter has not been a severe one, and there has not been enough ice to do any harm. He also states that because of the fact that it has not been freezing and thawing the wheat will not be damaged. He looks for a big crop of fall wheat this year, provided there are no setbacks in the spring.

Shantymen's Christian Association
The Rev. Thos. Joplin, Field Secretary of the above association is staying in the city for a few days in the Society's interests. The Shantymen's Christian Association does splendid work amongst the lumber men in Canada, eighteen missionaries are employed, and their work during 1918 includes the following:

3,984 Miles walked to and from Camps.
1,231 Miles done by dog train.
545 Camps visited.
667 Gospel meetings held.
30,256 Men ministered to.
5,232 French-speaking men.
7,700 Foreigners.
Thousands of little Gospels given to applicants.
The work is carried on through winter as well as summer and the missionaries endure untold hardships, tramping from one camp to another in the most bitter weather.
The case of two brother missionaries, H. E. and W. E. Winslow, is well worthy of mention, for during last year they walked 675 miles and reached over 3000 men.
The records of the other members are well up to this standard and it can be easily seen that great and useful work is being accomplished.
