Beijing Chinese Language and **Culture School General Regulations** on Enrolment in 1990

I. Nature and Aim of the School

The Beijing Chinese Language and Culture School teaches modern Chinese and Chinese culture. It is aimed at providing conditions for overseas Chinese, compatriots from Hong Kong and Macao, and foreigners of Chinese origin to learn Chinese language and culture, and serving to promote cultural exchanges and friendly contacts between China and other countries.

II. Facilities and Conditions of the School Neighbouring Beijng's western suburb, our school,

with convenient transport- facilities and a quiet environment, is an ideal place for study.

Our school has a strong teaching faculty, with teachers all university graduates. They are dedicated to Chinese-language education and have gained rich experience from teaching. Following the principle of combining tour with study, our school regularly organizes study tours for students. This has helped constantly improve teaching quality.

Our school is complete with a number of facilities specially for students, including audio-visual education equipment and rich store of acoustic and image materials. Our school's library, reference room and reading room are well-stocked with materials, books and magazines for both teachers and students.

In order to liven up after-school life, our students are organized on a regular basis to see theatrical performances, do taijiquan (a kind of traditional Chinese shadow boxing) and taiji sword or to study national musical instruments and folk dances.

Our school has a cafeteria in service of students. III. Classes, Period of Schooling, enrolment Conditions

curricula, Expenses, and Entrance Date 1. Junior Grade for Chinese Language Period of Schooling: One year

Our school enrols overseas Chinese, compatriots from Hong Kong and Macao, and foreigners of Chinese origin as students, who have an education above the junior middle school level, are aged at 15 or above, and do not know or know only a little Chinese. Through study, the students will be able to have an initial understanding of the Chinese culture and to have a good command of everyday expressions and basic knowledge about Chinese language, acquiring some ability in hearing, speaking, reading and writing.

Curricula:

Required courses: Basic Chinese language, comprehension, conversation, reading and writing: Elective courses: Chinese folk dances, wushu (martial arts), traditional Chinese painting, and calligraphy.

Expenses (foreign exchange certificate required): Each student is required to pay FEC ¥ 150 for tuition for one semester, FEC¥685forlodging (bedclothes, mosquitonets, and other beddings included), FEC¥ 100 for books and study articles, FEC ¥ 350 for in-city travelling (all students are required to pay this fee only for the first semester), and FEC ¥ 60 for recreation. Students are required to make their own eating arrangements.

Entrance Date: Registration extends from August 27 to 31, 1990; school begins on September 1, 1990.

2. Intermediate Class for Chinese Language This class is specially for overseas Chinese compatriots from Hong Kong and Macao, and foreigners of Chinese origin who have an education at or above or equal to the senior middle school level, are aged between 18 and 35, and can speak some Chinese and read easy and

simple Chinese books. Strict training will be given to students to improve their hearing, speaking, reading and writing so that they can proficiently use Chinese language in scoial intercourse.

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Curricula: Required courses: Writing, conversation, listening,

reading, general knowledge, selected newspaper stories, and tourist geography;

Elective courses: Chinese folk dances, Wushu (martial arts), traditional Chinese painting, and callirgraphy.

Expenses (foreign exchange certificate required): Each student is required to pay FEC ¥ 150 for tuition for one semester. FEC¥685 for lodging (bedclothes, mosquito-nets and other beddings included), FEC ¥ 100 for books and study articles and FEC ¥ 60 for recreation. The students are required to make their own eating

Entrance Date: Registration extends from August 27 to 31, 1990; school begins on September 1, 1990.

3. Senior Class for chinese Language Period of Schooling: One year

Our school enrols students from among overseas Chinese, compatriots from hong Kong and Macao, and foreigners of Chinese origin who have an education at or above or equal to the senior middle school level, are aged between 18 and 40, and can speak some Chinese and read ome Chinese books. through study, the students are expected to grasp the basic Chinese language theory and necessary cultural knowledge. Comprehensive technical training in hearing, speaking, reading writing and translation willbe given to the students, who are expected to acquire the ability of doing ordinary Chinese language interpretation, serving as chinese language secretary of copy clerks and teaching Chinese language.

Required courses: Selected article readings, writing, modern Chinese, selected clasical Chinese readings, selected newspaper stories, and translation;

Elective courses: Chinese folk dances, wushu (martial arts), traditional Chinese painting, calligraphy, Chinese history, and foreign trade.

Expenses (foreign exchange certificate requied): Each student should pay FEC ¥ 150 for tuition for one semester, FEC ¥ 685 for lodging (bedclothes, mosquitonets and other beddings included), FEC ¥ 100 for books and other study articles, and FEC ¥ 60 for recreation. The students are required to make their own eating arrangements.

Entrance Date: Registration extends from August 27 to 31, 1990; school begins on September 1, 1990.

4. Short-term Chinese Language Class (three types) (1) Short-term Class for Chinese Language

Period of Schooling: Half a year
Our school enrols students from among overseas Chinese, compatriots from Hong Kong and Macao, and foreigners of Chinese origin who are aged between 15 and 40, and do not know or know only a little Chinese. through study, the students are expected to grasp a certain amount of everyday expressions, and preliminarily acquire the ability of hearing, speaking, reading and writing Chinese.

Curricula: Basic Chinese, conversation, hearing and

Expenses (foreign exchange certificate required): Each student should pay FEC¥150 for tuition, FEC ¥ 685 for lodging (bedclothes, mosuqito-nets and other beddings included), FEC ¥ 100 for books and other study articles, FEC¥350 for in-city travelling, and FEC ¥ 60 for recreation. The students should make their own eating arrangements.

Entrance Date: Registration extends from August 27 to 31, 1990; school begins on September 1, 1990.

(2) Accelerated Course for Chinese Language Period of Schooling: Two months

Our school enrols students from among overseas Chinse, compatriots from Hong Kong and Macao, and foreigners of chinese origin. Through special training in hearing and speaking, the students are expected to preliminarily grasp some everyday expressions in conversation. Lessons are given five days a week (Monday through Friday), and visits and tour are organized at weekends.

Curricula: Conversation, reading and handwriting. Expenses (foreign exchange certificate required): Each student should pay FEC ¥ 100 for tuition. FEC ¥ 270 for lodging, FEC ¥ 50 for books and other study articles, and FEC ¥ 230 for in-city travelling and recreation. The students are required to make their own eating arrangements.

Entrance Date: Registration extends from March 27 to 31, 1990; school begins on April 1, 1990.

(3) Accelerated Course for Chinese language

Period of Schooling: Six weeks Our school enrols students from among overseas Chinese, compatriots from hong Kong and Macao, and foreigners of Chinese origin who do not know or know only a little Chinese. Through special training in hearing and speaking, the students are expected to initially grasp some phrases of common use and be able to engage in simple conversations. Lessons are given five days a week (Monday through Friday), and visits or tour are organized at weekends.

Curricula: Conversation, reading and handwriting. Expenses (foreign exchange certificate required): Each student should pay FEC ¥ 60 for tuition. FEC ¥ 180 for lodging. FEC ¥ 30 for books and other study articles. and FEC ¥ 140 for in-city travelling and recreation. The students should make their own eating arrangements.

Entrance Date; Registration extends from June 12 to 14, 1990; school begins on June 15, 1990. 5. Short-term Dance Class (for two terms)

Period of Schooling: Two months

Our school enrols students from among overseas Chinese, compatriots from Hong Kong, and Macao, and foreigners of Chinese origin who are aged between 20 and 30 and love Chinese dances, through study, the students are expected to be fully qualified for teaching children dances and create simple dances for the children.

Curricula: Basic dance skill, national folk dance, dance rehearsal, dance performance for emulation, dance creation, and dance music.

Expenses (foreign exchange certificate requried): Each student should pay FEC ¥ 300 for tuition for each term, FEC ¥ 275 for lodging, FEC ¥ 120 for performance tickets and recreation, and FEC ¥ 200 for in-city travelling. the students are required to make their own eating arrangements.

Entrance Date:

- The first term; Registration extends from March 29 to 30, 1990; school beings on April 1, 1990. -- The second term: registration extends from June

29 to 30, 1990; school begins on July 1, 1990. 6. Summer Camp

The summer camp is aimed to, through lectures on China's landscapes, language and folk and national dances, enable the students to know history, culture and custom of the Chinese nation, so as to promote cultural exchanges between China and other countries. the camp mainly enrols youngsters.

(1) Chinese Folk, National Dance Summer Camp Time April 6-25, 1990

Contents of activity: Learning Chinese folk and national dances, visiting Beijing's places of interest and

Expenses: 1,400 yuan in foreign exchange certificate.

After the conclusion of this summer camp, the students may take part in the other summer camp organized by our school. In this case, they are required to

pay for it. (2) The Beijing-Chengde Chinese Language Summer

Camp time: April 6-25, 1990

Contents of activity: Learning Chinese language and culture. Touring scenic spots and historical sites in Beijing (18 days) and Chengde (3 days) -- the Great Wall, the Palace Museum, the Summer Palace, the Temple of Heaven, Yuanmingyuan ruins, the Grand View Garden, Chengde's Summer Resort, Eight Outer Temples, etc. Visiting schools, factories, villages and the facilities of the Asian Games in Beijing. Having a party with Beijng's young people and teenagers.

Expenses: 1,600 yuan in foreign exchange certificate. (3) The Beijing-Xiamen Chincse Language Summer

Camp Time: May 2-20, 1990

Contents of acitivity: Learning Chinese language and culture. Touring Beijing's places of interest and historical sites (13 days) -- the Great Wall, the Summer Palace, the Palace Museum, the Temple of Heaven, Yuanmingyuan ruins, the Grand View Garden, and the scenic spots in Xiamen and Quanzhou (six days)--Gulangyu, Nanputuo Temple, Jimei Village, etc. Visiting factories. Villages and schools in Beijing and Xiamen. Having a party with local young people and icenagers.

Expenses: 1,850 yuan in foreign exchange certificate. (4) Beijing-Qingdao Chinese Language Summer

Time: July 20-August 8, 1990

Contents of activity: Learning the Chinese language and culture. Touring the places of interest and historical sites of Beijing (12 days), Taishan Mountains (2 day), and qingdao (4 days) -- the Great Wall, Palace Museum. Summer Palace, Temple of heaven, Grand View Garden, Taishan Mountains, Daimiao Temple, the Landing Stage, Laoshan Mountain, Bathing Beach, the Badaguan (eight major passes) Scenic Area, etc. Visiting factories villages, schools in Beijing and Qingdao. Having a social party with local young people and teenagers.

Expenses: 2,100 yuan in foreign exchange certificate. (5) Beijing-Sichuan Chinese Language Summer

Time; July 20-August 8, 1990

Contents of activity: Learning Chirese language and culture. Touring Beijing's scenic spots and historical sites 10 days)--the Great Wall, Palace Museum, Summer Palace, Temple of Heaven, Grand View garden; the places of interest and historical sites of Sichuan (5 days)-the Wuhou Temple, the thatched cottage of the Tang dynasty poet Du fu, Dujiangyan Dam, the Giant Budda in Leshan, the Emei Mountain, and the Three gorges of the Yangtze River (3 days), the Gezhouba Dam, and Wuhan's Huanghe tower (2 days).

Expenses: 2,750 yuan in foreign exchange certificate. (6) Beijing-Hangzhou chinese Language Summer

Time: July 20-August 8, 1990

Contents of activity: Learning the Chinese language

Touring places of interest and historical sites in Beijng (12 days)--the Grat Wall, Summer Palace, Palace Museum, Temple of heaven, Grand View Garden; scenic areas of Nanjing (2 days) -- Dr Sun Yat-sen Mausoleum, the Oinhuai river, Suzhou gardens (2 days) including the Lion garden, the Zhouzheng Garden, the Tiger Hill, the Hanshan Temple; scenic spots of Hangzhou (2 days)--West Lake, Lingyin Temple, Hupao (racing tiger), liuhe Pagoda, etc. Sightseeing in Beijing, Nanjing, Suzhou and Shanghai (2 days) and visiting factories there. Having a

party with local young people and teenagers. Expenses: 2,200 yuan in foreign exchange certificate.

(7) Beijing-Qinhuangdao Chinese Language Summer Camp

Time: July 20-August 8, 1990 Contents of activity: Learning the Chinese language

and culture. Touring scenic spots and places of historical interest in Beijing (12 days)-- Great Wall, Palace Museum, Summer Palace, Temple of Heaven, Grand View Garden; the scenic areas and historical sites of shijiazhuang (4 days)--the Zhengshi Rock, the Cangyan Mountain, the Mansion for the Rongguo Family, the journey to the West Palace; scenic spots and places of historical interest in Qinhuangdao (4 days)--Shanhaiguan Pass (the starting point of the Great Wall), Laolongtou (dragon head), the Lady Meng Jiangnu Temple, and seaboard summer resort. Visiting factories, villages and schools in Beijing and Shijiazhuang. Having a party with local young people and teenagers.

Expenses: 1,900 yuan in foreign exchange certificate.

IV. Enrolment Qualifications 1. Anyone who is in good health, correct in behaviour and determined to learn the Chinese language and culture, and meets the qualifications of enrolment

can sign up for study. 2. Filling in an application and sending it directly to the school dean's office.

3. Those who are enrolled should go to the Chinese embassy or consulate in their country, bringing with them the admision notice, for study visa. Then at the specified time, they should bring with them the admission notice, passort (X visa), certificate of schooling record, three oneinch, full-faced, half-length and bareheaded photos and four two-inch photos to register at the school.

4. After their arrival at the school, new students will be organized to go to the hospital for physical examination (at their own expense). Anyone found to be unsuitable for study at the school should immediately perform necessary

procedures for leaving school. 5. During the period of study at school, anyone who has broken China's law and the school's rules and regulations but refuses to mend his or her way despite

education shall be asked to quit school. 6. As for students who leave school halfway, the fees they have paid will not be refunded. Students who pass the examination at the end of their schooling will be issued a diploma or a certificate showing courses

attended. 7. Those who wish to participate in the summer camp should apply two months in advance. Be sure to book international return plane tickets.
