For the Senior Class:

In the same subjects and books as for the University Class.

#### For the Junior Class:

In the 1st and 3rd books of the Odes of Horsce; Euclid, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd books or Legendre's Cometrie. by Davies, let and 3rd books, with the problems; and such works in English History and Modern Geography as the candidates may have ...ad and that this Order be published every Term, with the admission of such Term.
