

Erindale wrestler breaks leg in Canadian championship opener

Erindale Raider wrestler Ken Deally went to Thunder Bay Thursday looking for the 105½ pound Canadian freestyle championship, but came home Monday with a cast from his left ankle to his left knee as his only decoration.

In an unfortunate accident that marred what Ken thought were his excellent

chances for the Canadian title, he broke his leg and dislocated his ankle in his first fight.

He was ahead 3-0 against Gary Gilbert of Orillia Park after the first round when the leg was twisted and snapped. Forced to forfeit his match, Deally lost his chance in both freestyle and Greco-Roman competitions

when he was admitted to hospital for three days.

The disappointed 20-year-old returned to his McBride Avenue home Monday morning.

"It really rips me up," he said. "I expected to win. I'd seen some of the guys in the warmups and I think I had it all the way. Eric Fobert finished second."

Fobert, from Georgetown in Halton, was beaten by Deally in the Ontario high school wrestling meet.

Still anxious to prove that he is worthy of all-Canadian contention, Deally says he will be entering an open freestyle match this summer at the University of Guelph.

"Maybe I can prove something there," he says.
