Memorandum

It does not appear from the letters or estracts transmitted by M'Steers that den John Collevene intended to purchase or to rent the property of the late M bornatinger at the expense afthe Indean Department; the cost of the purchase was to be defrayed from the funds of the dociety for the propagation of the Gospel, and an appeal. was made to the generosity of the Impereal yovern ment because the dociety had not the means to pay £ 400. (vide M Matthews letter appendix Nos.) If the Link: fovernor had intended to pay the amount from the funds of the Indian Department, he could have ifsued his Warrant nuthout appealing to the Secretary of State, as in the cases where he allows on his authority £ 151 & £ 10%, and again (M Mathens letter 24 april 1834) you will be "allowed a small sum of money from the Indian Department to fut the house in external repair-It was is puted that the Indians would herefit spiritually from the establishment of the Mession and it was right they should contribute to its

In the extract from the distach of Sir John Collowne 14. August 1834 he "has author used some aid " a miord has been omitted in capying this ohr patch miss t likely the mord to, but the Secut Governor nombers ne fens to an intention to pay for the property from the funds of the Indian Department.
