The society of which Mr. Favre is a memeber now propose to commence evangelical work in the United Kingdom. With this object they have selected him as one of their first representatives and have instructed him to proceed to London about the 14th of next month. Mr. Favre has therefore applied to me for a British passport.

I have informed Mr. Favre that, in view of his prolonged absence from Canada, I am unable to grant him a British passport without the express authorization of the Canadian Government, (it would hardly be possible to obtain this before the date on which he wishes to leave for London); but that I should be prepared to viser his Swiss passport for the United Kingdom.

Mr. Favre states that he now intends to establish himself in the United Kingdom until such time as the Society calls on him to return to Canada in order to "evangelize" that country.

A copy of this despatch is being forwarded to the Governor General of Canada.
