

price thereof which may be unpaid;
 and that it appeared to me that
 the party who sold the horse to
 Dewasha could not legally recover
 on account of the mortgage given
 by Dewasha to him in so far
 as concerned the horse and har-
 ness owned by Dewasha previ-
 ously to his purchasing the other
 one from said party; but that
 the latter would be entitled to
 recover in so far as the horse
 purchased from him was con-
 cerned, unless Dewasha paid
 him for the same. I am still of
 the same opinion. But a Court
 of law can alone determine the
 point and Dewasha must, if
 he desires a decision in the
 matter,
