

Ottawa, 2nd July, 1891.

Sir:-

I received the following telegram from you yesterday:-

"Twenty families of Indians here nearly all down with relapse of la grippe. Many very ill and short of provision, having made no hunts. Doctor at Esquimaux Point sent down by Provincial Government. Will you order him to attend here. No news from Mr. Boucher. Reported he is not coming down".

In reply I wired you at once as follows:-

"Telegram received. Make most economical arrangement possible with Doctor sent by Provincial Government to likewise attend sick Indians. Please write full particulars of arrangement made and respecting sick Indians".
