

- (ii) The practical portions of previously announced courses for qualification for the rank of Captain (Reserve) have been cancelled.

The following schedule of courses at Schools of Instruction is now effective:

Practical portion

Lieutenant (Reserve)	31st October to 14th November, 1941.
Captain (Reserve)	21st November to 5th December, 1941.
Lieutenant (Reserve)	9th January to 23rd January, 1942.
Lieutenant (Reserve)	30th January to 13th February, 1942.
Captain (Reserve)	29th February to 6th March, 1942.

- (iii) The second Senior Officers' Course will commence at R.M.C., 1st October, 1941.

- (iv) The second Company Commanders' Course will commence at R.M.C., 28th September, 1941.

- (v) 15 candidates from the Pacific Command will attend a two weeks' course for unit and assistant instructors at No. 16 Infantry Training Centre (Rifle), Calgary. The course starts 15th September, 1941.

(b) Tradesmen's Training

Examples of the work of Tradesmen Trainees were exhibited at the Central Canada Exhibition, Ottawa. The exhibit included work done by Phase II Trainees at Technical Schools. A chart of projects undertaken by a class of Artificers, R.C.A., at the Ontario Training College for Technical Teachers, Hamilton, was featured.

(c) General

- (i) Allotment of Thompson Sub-Machine gun ammunition to Officers' Training Centres will be sufficient to permit the firing of 75% of range courses instead of 30% as anticipated.
- (ii) The Officers' class of reinforcements from C.S.T.C., Barriefield, demonstrated modern signal equipment at the Central Canada Exhibition, Ottawa, maintaining Wireless Communication with the C.S.T.C. throughout.

10. ORGANIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION

- (a) Organization and Strength of Formations and Units of the Active Army in Canada (as of 16th August, 1941)

(Figures in brackets refer to report of 9th August)

(i) 4th Canadian Division

The strength is 673 (643) Officers and 13,619 (13,067) Other Ranks. Wanted to complete establishment: 126 (126) Officers and 3,147 (2,988) Other Ranks.

The numbers required to complete establishment include 58 Officers and 1,471 Other Ranks of Artillery Units not yet authorized to mobilize.

The increase in strength over that of 9th August is due to the inclusion of the Princess Louise Fusiliers (M.G.)
