

- Q. What do you people do here for a living?
- A. There is not much land cultivated on the Reserve No.1 - Most of the time we are working around for to get our living.
- Q. You cultivate some of the land, do you?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Do you work out for whitepeople?
- A. Yes.
- Q. At what kind of work?
- A. At farming, and we freight a little.
- Q. For whitepeople?
- A. Yes, and some of the Indians have their own freighting outfit.
- Q. Is there anything they do that brings them in money?
- A. That is all.
- Q. Do you hunt or trap any?
- A. We go hunting, but some seasons they are closed.
- Q. You mean in the summer time you cannot hunt; or are you referring to the beaver?
- A. There is no beaver or there is no trapping.
- Q. Don't the Indians trap for fur at all?
- A. No.
- Q. You simply hunt for meat?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Do you fish any here?
- A. Yes, we are fishing but they won't let us fish all the time.
- Q. That is all the year round you mean?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Do you catch any salmon here?
- A. Just enough for our own use - we don't sell any. You people have power and authority to help us, and we would like to fish at any time that we want to fish.
- Q. For what kind of fish?
- A. There is a certain place where we are fishing up on the Fraser that we want to fish there all the time. Mr Graham and some of the other fellows went up there and stopped the Indians from fishing.
