The College year commences with the Autumn Term. The Autumn Term begins Sept. 10; Winter Term, Nov. 20; Spring Term, Feb. 15; Summer Term, May 1. Reports of the progress and conduct of the pupils are sent to parents twice each Term, or oftener if desired. Deducting the Vacations, the Terms are ten weeks each. The Tuition Fee is \$10 for one Pupil, \$9 each for two (brothers), \$8 each for three (brothers); and the Fee for Boarders, inclusive of Tuition, is \$45 per Term. The many improvements made in the arrangement of the College Boarding House have been found to add very materially to the comfort of the boarders. A large paved Ball Court and a Gymnasium, fitted up with the most approved modern appliances, and a spacious play-ground and cricket ground afford ample facilities for out-door exercise and amusement within the College bounds. The boarding house is conducted strictly as an integral part of the Institution, its disbursements paid out of, and its returns paid into, the general funds. Prizes of books and certificates of honor given every year to those who distinguish themselves in any of the subjects taught in the College. His Excellency the Governor General offers annually a valuable Prize of Books for the best examinations in the higher departments of the College Curriculum. At the Annual Public Examination in July, Exhibitions are competed for Grammar Schools of the whole Province. More than 2,500 of the youth of the whole Province have received their education, in whole or in part, in Upper Canada College. The First Classical, and the Mathematical Masters, were pupils of the Institution; as were likewise the greater portion of the Medal-men, Scholars, and Honor-men of our Universities.
