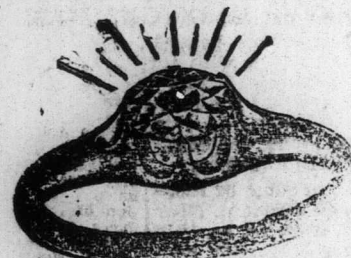

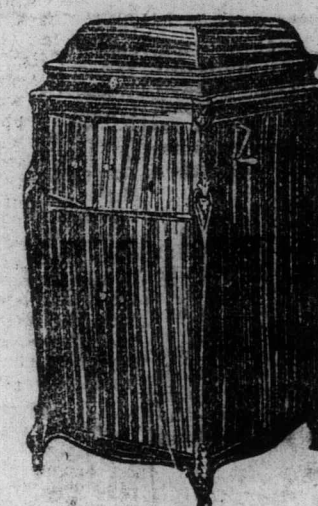

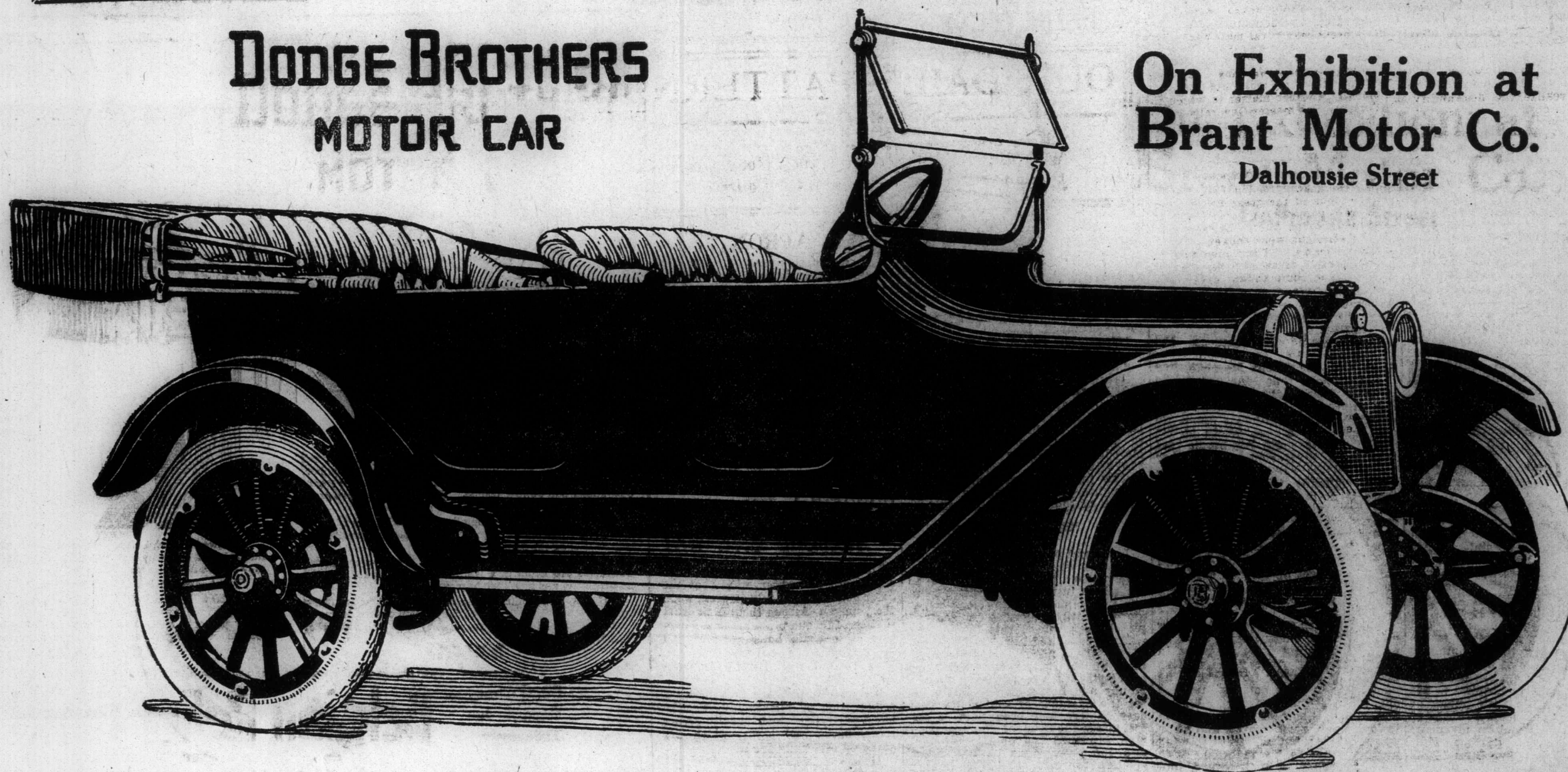

(Continued from Page Thirteen) the front. Much of the work is by non-combatants, but many of their tasks must be carried out under fire and some have been killed and others wounded.

When an officer or man is killed in the front, or dies of wounds, his body is now at once reported to the registration units. If killed in action he may still be buried in the way somewhere near the front so, the chaplain or officer who sees him, reports the position, grave, which as soon as possible marked with a durable cross and identification plate stamped in iron.

But this mode is becoming less common. The army has quick to realize the desirability of burying its dead in the near the 300 or more recognized cemeteries behind the lines.
