Ottawa, Dec. 25.—No definite con-clusion was reached at the confer-ence held on Saturday afternoon beeen R. B. Bennett, M.P., Chairman of the National Service Commiss and the Executive of the Dominic Trades and Labor Council. hree hours' discussion the conference was adjourned until Tuesday, when it is likely that Sir Robert Border will be present. The matter under discussion was the attitude of Labor towards National Service registra tion, which takes place the first weel

n January. Neither Mr. Bennett nor the repre sentatives of Labor had anything to give out at the conclusion of the con erence. It is understood, however that the representatives of Labor ex pressed the fear that registration was the forerunner of conscription, to which they told Mr. Bennett they are opposed. Mr. Bennett, it is believed told the Labor men that many of their fears were groundless, and urg ed upon them the desirability of a Canadians agreeing to answer the twenty-four questions to be put t them in order, that the inventory of Canada's man power may be con

Apparently Mr. Bennett and the Labor men were not able to get quite together, although it was intimated that progress was made in that direc tion, and it is hoped that an agree ment will be arrived at on Tuesday whereby the Trades and Labor Department will give its support to the egistration plans of the Nationa Service Commission.

Germany replies proposing an immediate conference "delegates of the belligerent s of "delegates of the belligerent tes at a neutral place," knowing t this proposal had already been a phatically rejected by the Eute Governments.

The President did not ask for peace conference. He recogni the fact that a conference at time was impossible, but expressible the hope that an "interchange views would clear the way at le for a conference.". Germany refuses all interchar of views and returns to the text the note of December 12, which c

tained the proposal of the Teuto powers "to enter forthwith peace negotiations." In the light of Germany's re to the President it is impossib believe that there was either hone or sincerity of purpose back of original peace proposal. It is penough now that the President's
