



A Great Arch of Scintillant Light, and Fountain of Fire. The partial eclipse of the moon which appened the 15th September, 1994, was beerved by the passengers and offices f the Red Star line Westernland, far of the Red Star line Westernland, far but at sea,, and they had a good view of the phenomenon, which was accompanied by an electrical display of rare beauty.
