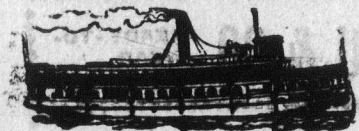

BRANCH LINES OF G.T.P.

Carvell Amendment to Build to St. John, N. B., Carries.

Bell Telephone Co.'s Bill Stands For Third Reading Until House Has Passed General Telephone Legislation—Minister of Militia Will Look Into Charge That Men Served Under Assumed Names at Niagara.

Ottawa, June 26.—In the House yesterday Col. Sam Hughes read a statement that there were 2,000 men out of a total of 5,000 in the Niagara militia camp serving under assumed names, and that many first year men were being set down as second and third year men so as to draw the increased pay. If such a state of things were true, said Col. Hughes, the offenders must have committed forgery, and, moreover, the officers must be cognizant.

Sir Frederick Borden said that there were a number of men at camp at Niagara who appeared on the rolls under assumed names, but that the number was greatly exaggerated. However, he had called the attention of the adjutant-general to the statement and the matter was being investigated.

The House at its morning session considered at length in committee the bill to increase the capital stock of the Bell Telephone Co. There was a long discussion on the measure, and Mr. Macdonald requested the first Minister to permit the bill to stand until the telephone amendments to the Railway Act were disposed of, and warned the Government that he and other Conservatives would hold up the bill in committee indefinitely. This led to a conference at the noon-hour, and at 3 o'clock the Bell Co. bill was reported, but the same must stand for third reading until the House has passed the general telephone legislation.

Branch Lines of G. T. P.

There was the usual debate in committee in the afternoon between the New Brunswick members concerning the branch lines to be built by the Grand Trunk Pacific from Moncton to the sea. The matter came up on an amendment offered by Mr. Carvell (Carleton, N. B.) to the pending bill to incorporate the Grand Trunk Pacific Branch Lines Co. He insisted upon a branch being built to St. John, N. B., and ridiculed the position taken by Mr. Emmerson, that the moral obligation resting upon the G. T. P. to build to St. John was sufficient without any kind of amendment. Although opposed by the Ministers present, the amendment carried—yeas 44, nays 20.

Divorce Bill Passes.

The Mackintosh divorce bill was passed.

Telephone Amendments.

The telephone amendments to the Railway Act were taken up as the first Government order last night. The clause with relation to the railway stations will be re-drafted in accordance with the discussion, and after discussion the clause providing for exchange of business stands over for further consideration.

Provincial Rights.

Mr. Boyce (West Algona) opposed the bill to incorporate the Pacific & Atlantic Co. This road is projected from Cornwall and Ottawa to the Soo. He pointed out that it was a provincial road, and should not apply for a Dominion charter.

R. L. Borden and other members of the Opposition protested against invading provincial rights.

The bill carried without division.

Provide For 32.

A return was brought down showing that the Laurier Government had appointed no less than five Senators and twenty-seven members of Parliament to places of emolument under the Crown since 1896.

Metal For Transcontinental.

Ottawa, June 26.—The Government has awarded contracts for steel rails and fastenings for two sections of the National Transcontinental Railway, amounting in all to \$2,488,450. Of this sum \$2,235,000 will be expended upon steel rails, the contracts for \$1,127,000 going to the Dominion Iron & Steel Co., Sydney, N. S., and \$1,108,000 to the Algoma Steel Co.'s Sault Ste. Marie works. The total quantity of steel rails required is 65,000 tons. Of this quantity 55,000 tons will be furnished at \$34 per ton, and the remaining 10,000 tons by the Dominion Iron & Steel Co. at an advance of 50 cents per ton.

Stories Didn't Tally.

Chancellor Boyd refers to a conflict of evidence between Mr. Haines and Mr. Blair, the latter's testimony casting doubt on Mr. Haines having been in the locality at the time stated. Haines could give nothing that would check his own movements in his November visit.

Summing up his lordship finds the affidavit "not a true disclosure of the real facts of the discovery." The issue of the leases thereon by subordinate officers pending proper enquiries was imprudent, and the grants should be vacated. He adds:

"I do not find proof any conspiracy or fraud on the part of the defendants who now own the mine. They did what was right in attempting to uphold a patent issued in their favor, and their conduct is not such that they should be visited with costs."

"They are also entitled to be compensated by the Crown for the expenditures made by them on the lot in so far as it has enhanced its value as a mining property. This is to be ascertained by the master, without costs to either, in case they cannot agree as to the amount."

Gets Notice of Removal.

Peterboro, June 26.—Geo. Cochrane, for the past twenty years license inspector for West Peterboro, has received notice from the license department to hand over the books and papers to his office on July 1 to Police Constable Stewart, who will succeed him. In reply Cochrane sent a letter to Toronto in which he says that, if he is to be dismissed, he will not hand over the books, etc., in his possession until they are properly audited by an officer of the department and accepted by him as correct.

No Timed Goods For Army.

London, June 26.—In behalf of War Secretary Haldane, Mr. Buchanan, financial secretary to the War Office, announced in the House of Commons yesterday that orders had been issued to withhold all issue to the army of American brands of preserved meat until Lieut.-Col. Hobbs, the officer despatched to the United States to inquire into their character, has reported.

Murdoch's Body Found.

Pembroke, June 26.—The body of Richard Murdoch, telegraph operator of Westmeath, who was drowned May 24, in the rapid below Petrolake, was found yesterday near the scene of the tragedy. The remains will be taken to his home in Bobaygeon.

Methodist Church Struck.

Belleville, June 26.—During a severe thunderstorm that passed over a portion of Hastings County on Saturday afternoon, the Methodist Church at Bethel, Thurlow Township, was struck by lightning. About \$500 damage was done to the structure.

Prof. Smith Gives Bursary.

Toronto, June 26.—It was announced at the prize-day exercises of St. Andrew's College yesterday, that Prof. Goldwin Smith had offered a bursary of \$300 per year, for four years.

Aged 82, Tries to Suicide.

Stratford, June 26.—Jacob Bennett, aged 82, an inmate of the House of Refuge, made a savage slash at his throat with a penknife and ripped an ugly gash in it, almost from ear to ear. The old man made a dash for the window, opened it, and attempted to clamber on to the window sill, his intention evidently being to throw himself to the ground. His leap was frustrated.

Loemen Sent to Jail.

Toledo, O., June 26.—In common pleas court yesterday, Judge Kinade imposed the maximum sentence of \$5,000 fine and one year in the workhouse on five loemen guilty of conspiracy in restraint of trade. The judge said the sentences might be mitigated in the event of the men making restitution.
