GEOLOGICAL. Col. Grant Continued Paper on Science and Theology. The geological section met last night, A. T. Neill in the chair. A paper was read by Col. C. C. Grant, entitled "Science and Theology, Continued." He said that when Prof. Townsend, of Boston, stated at the Toronto meeting that transmutation of species was unknown in nature, and that no evidence of hybrid life had been found, he stated what was said by a prominent member of the English Anthropological Society to be an error. Does it not seem incredible, he said, to find a gentleman in the position he occupies so ignorant of all the important discoveries made by his own countrymen of the United States in Egypt. That the higher civilization had been proved to have existed there 8,000 years before the Christian era, and was preceded by a palaeolithic stone age.
