EYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old may homedead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba. Saskat-diewan or Alberta. Applicant must oppear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres on artain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. Live stock may be substituted for entityation under certain conditions. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his home dead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning hamestead patent; also 50 acres expa cultivation Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as home-dead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased hemestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 51 was and erect a house worth \$300 w. W. CORY.
