Unwritten History.

During the Northern gale which raged on the Labrador in September, 14 craft which were bound, south sheltered in a mild place called Mullins Cove and the whole fleet came near being lost. One vessel, the "Little Stream" was dashed to pieces on the rocks and over 100 persons had barely time to get into their boats and make for the shore when the sea began to make a clean break over all the craft. Their decks were swept, sails torn and bulwarks and other parts smashed, and how the vessels rode out the storm which lasted three days, is a mystery. The people from the craft, over 100 in all and including several young boys and girls had to stow themselves as best they could in the few houses which are the only habitations there and remained three days. It was intensely cold with torrents of rain falling and but for the kindness of the people of the place in giving the fugitives from the storm shelter several must have perished.

The Tangle in the East.

PARIS, To-day.
The threatened rupture between Austria-Hungary and Serbia on the question of a Serbian access to the Adriatic Sea and numerous other political quicksands caused by the collapse of Turkey, are causing grave concern in diplomatic circles in Paris, when intimate accord is most desirable than ever before. It is pointed out that two groups of European nations, known as the Triple Alliance and the Triple Entente, which together composed the Concord of Europe, find themselves badly out of tune and arrayed in hostile camps. With Russia leading, France and England are inclined to support the Serbian claims, on which Austria-Hungary, encouraged by Germany and Italy, have apparently placed a direct veto. Among other bustling international difficulties are the compensation Romania demands as a set-off for the agrarianism of Bulgaria, the future standing of the Dardanelles, Constantinople, Saloniki, Turkey in Asia, and Aegean Islands. Along with these comes the news of the proclamation of a Russian protectorate over Chinese territory equal in extent to one-third of the whole of Europe.

Shannahan, Delaney and Tucker

Have a Chat on the Recent Election.
Up to Tucker's last night, all the "boys" were gathered, discussing the result of the Presidential Election. Tucker, read out the news, while Delaney, The Cate, Mount and Mrs. Tucker held their breath in silent wonder.
"Every dog has his day," said Delaney and every politician meets his Waterloo when the time arrives. 'Tis a strange thing, says Tucker, but somehow or other sentiment gets in the air, and no matter how strenuous a leader works, he must take a back seat when the tide turns against him, and 'tis just as well to try and stem the falls of Niagara, as expect to win out once the change sets in.
Delaney believes in having a catchy cry, some quick sounding slogan that has a popular ring about it, and he says it has a greater effect in winning an election, than all the long winded arguments that could be poured out by the bushel. Nobody seems to be able to account for the turn of the tide, and if we look for the cause that leads to it, we will be put to our wit's end, to arrive at a satisfactory explanation. Delaney believes that the small boy shouting the slogan counts a great deal, and that many a first class man went under, because of the persistent shout of the boy on the street. We have only to look at the result of Elections in our own country, and we will realize that misfits in many districts have ousted brilliant men, simply because of some popular catch cry that awayed the minds of the People. Now Delaney says, 'tis an indisputable fact that in many districts we have Representatives who are nothing, only in numbers. One strong man, in a district where three are elected, is able to drag in two incapables with him, simply because they belong to the Party, and because the hold which Party Politics has in this country. We often send weak-nerved individuals to represent us, and we are down men of brains, because they were on the opposing side. Delaney says 'twould be a grand thing if we could see eye to eye with each other, and agree to send the best men to the Assembly, but he feels 'twould be a long day ere we'll reach that stage of civilization, and in the meantime owing to the hold that Parties has upon us, he would suggest that the number of members in the House, be cut down to Seventeen at the next election, for he believes that nineteen if they are simply followers, who go where they're told by the strong man that holds the reins in each district, 'twould be like to know what's the use of having three men representing a district, where one would do just as much good? 'Tis simply firing away good money on useless ornaments who don't even feel themselves, that they could win an election without the Big Towline. Then, again, says Delaney, 'twould be a great improvement to have one man representing our district, because, he wouldn't have the others to distract his attention, or not carrying out his promises, and could more easily bog one and get a square answer out of him, than to lose time in trying to get the three of 'em together. Delaney says he only place you'll meet your three members together is, at a funeral in the fall of the elections, after that, they scatter, and the next time they go in covies is when a corner tone is being laid. Therefore the ne member in one district, would be a great improvement, for at any rate he wouldn't live long, and in hat way others would get a chance to come on top.
Tucker is simply amazed that the count in the Elections "Tip Along" come in so quick, and he'd suggest o the "Powers that be" that they ask for a wrinkle, for if we had that many votes to count around here, tables would be born on polling day would have a vote by the time the returns were in.

COLOGNE, Nov. 9.
It is reported at Cologne that the Porte has proposed to Bulgaria begin peace negotiations without mediation of the Powers, according to a despatch to the Cologne Gazette.

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LONDON, Nov. 9.
A wild rush of demoralized hungry mobs of soldiers into the doomed city of Constantinople, greatly to the general terror. The Turks have crossed the Bosphorus and many Europeans are seeking refuge aboard steamships. The Sultan's yacht is waiting in readiness to him to Brusa in Asia Minor, and Imperial Treasury has already sent away twenty warships. Powers will place before the B. States to-day the fact that Turkey applied for Mediation, but it is feared that the Allies will insist.
