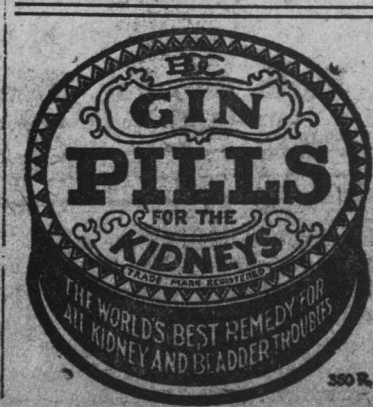

Gigantic Trans-Atlantic Liners.

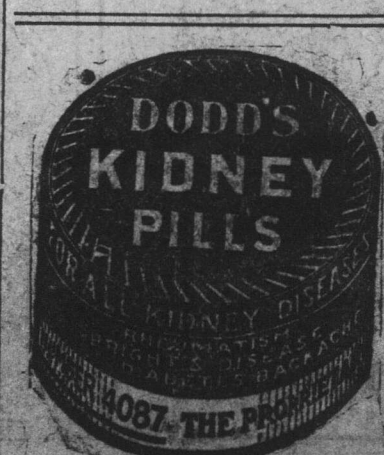
When the S. S. Leviathan commences her work in the North Atlantic passenger trade in July next, there will be five vessels ranging from 45,000 to 56,000 tons which will make the port of Southampton their European terminal. These ships are the Majestic, Leviathan, Berengaria, Olympic and Aquitania. With regard to vessels of this size the question of dry-docking facilities is of great importance. Three of the vessels named are German built, and provision was made for dry-docking them at Hamburg by building a large floating dock. This structure was surrendered to Great Britain after the war, and the White Star Company offered the Government £100,000 for it. The

sum demanded, however, was £200,000, and as this was considered far too high, the negotiations fell through, and then the British Government sold the dock to the Germans for £40,000! The Trafalgar Dock at Southampton, after a little extension,



is now capable of accommodating vessels of any size except the Majestic and Leviathan. To remove this disability a floating dock is now under construction by Messrs. Armstrong, Whitworth & Co., and when it is completed and in place it will not be necessary for the two vessels named to be dry-docked elsewhere. It is an interesting question as to how many ports there are in the world where ships of this enormous tonnage can undergo hull repairs or cleaning. The only graving dock in the British Islands which is capable of admitting these huge vessels is the Gladstone Dock, Liverpool. Unfortunately, however, this is at present out of commission and will remain so for the next 18 months, during which time that section of the estate of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board is being extended and developed. New docks are being constructed, and a

new river entrance made. Had the large vessels now based upon Southampton used the port of Liverpool the Board would have allowed the Gladstone Dock to remain in com-



mission. As it is, however, the port will not suffer during the time it is closed while work is proceeding on the reconstruction scheme. This question of dry dock accommodation for super ships emphasises the fact that the range of selection of ports with dry-docking facilities for the largest type of Atlantic liners is comparatively limited. The Majestic, it must be remembered, has a length between perpendiculars of 515 ft. 2 in.; a beam of 100 ft. 1 in.; and depth of 58 ft. 2 in. The Leviathan is 7 ft. 8 in. shorter, but 2 in. more in beam. In order that such ships can be comfortably dry-docked, it is obvious that the graving dock will have to be in excess of those dimensions, except in the matter of depth. With regard to the latter, there will certainly have to be a little more than 40 ft. of water on the sill to take them without risk. —Syren and Shipping.
