General Booth.

The city of St. Thomas is to be favored with a visit from the world general of the Salvation army, who is making a tour of the North American continent. The largest churches of all denominations have been opened to him and a right royal welcome he has received wherever he has gone. This is proof of the fact that the Salvation army war has a prominent place in the public esteem. Its operations now extend to many countries, and its achievements the reclamation of thousands of the most degraded, commands the profoundest respect of the Christian public. Not only so, but the State also has cause for gratitude in a decrease of pauperism and crime, by its means. The public can therefore well afford to honor the man who, with one of the most saintly of women, in the late Mrs. Booth, organized and maintained an ever increasing movement for the amelioration of the poor, the destitute and the tempted. The public meeting at 7:30 p.m. will be held in Ducomb's opera house. The general will give an address on the social and spiritual work of the army, referring to his darkest England scheme which has met with such success. An address of welcome will be read. Judge Ermatinger will preside. London brass band, minstrels, and leading citizens will be present.

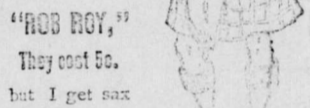
