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EVIDENCE FOR CROWN HAS BEEN COMPLETED!

His Lordship Objected to the Flood of Medical Testimony and Prosecution Terminated.

Experts Testify in Gerald Sifton's Defense—Leading Toronto Authorities Declare That Injuries Were More Compatible With a Fall Than With Blows.

Monday Afternoon.

The second act in the drama of life and death being enacted in the old courthouse of Middlesex county was reached at 3:30 yesterday afternoon.

When the crown announced that all its evidence in the Sifton murder case was in, and the defense was immediately proceeded with.

The third act, according to one of the counsel for the defense, will probably be reached Wednesday afternoon or Thursday morning.

When the defense will bring its case to a close, and the addresses to the jury will begin.

THE CROWN'S CASE. It will be noticed that the crown put in the box only 19 of 42 lay witnesses.

On the conclusion of the evidence given by Dr. E. Morris, of Delaware, the first witness called after the noon adjournment yesterday.

DR. TEASDALL. Dr. G. W. Teasdale, who has practiced in London for 14 years, in his evidence was taken largely over the ground covered by previous medical witnesses.

DR. HOSSACK. Dr. Thomas Hossack, Lucan, said the wounds could either have been caused by blows or a fall.

DR. FERGUSON. Dr. John Ferguson, educated in Toronto for twenty years, was the last witness called for the crown.
