

Associated Press Despatch Melbourne, Victoria, Nov. 13.-The Labor premier of Victoria, G. M. Prendergast, resigned office today as a result of the defeat of his government in parliament yesterday on a no-confidence vote and the refusal of the governor, the Earl of Stradbroke, to accede to his request for parliamentary dissolution.
Following yesterday's defeat of the Labor government, which was by a vote off 34 to 28, the parliament adjourned until Nov. 18. The Labor ministry took office last June.
