THE POSSIBILITIES OF DENATURIZED ALCOHOL.

There is scarcely any limit to the extent which alcohol for industrial purposes may be manufactured from the products of the farm, and now that the Standard Oil company, because of the revenue tax that formerly prevented its production at a sufficiently cheap rate to compete with gasoline and other fuels, there is a large prospective demand. Of course, there has been provision made for inspection so as to afford the necessary safeguards in the public interests.

The bill did not become law without opposition. This was forthcoming from the Standard Oil company, who fear that if it will be passed, it will take the place of gasoline in many instances, and the manufacturers of wood alcohol, who fear that it will be used for their business.

Denaturized alcohol is used in Germany in stoves, ranges and lamps, and makes beautiful light at a cost of one-third of that of kerosene. It will also be used extensively in motor cars and motor boats, and in other ways.
