



GRAND FORKS, Nov. 12.—"I believe that 60 per cent. of the Liberals in the province are supporting my programme" said Premier McBride, at the Grand Forks opers house last night to the largest audience the town has turned out to a political meeting. Cattle on Prairies.

CALGARY, Nov. 12.—Dr. D. G. Rutherford, livestock commissioner for Canada, in a special report on the livestock industry in the West, has this to say: "The ranching industry in Canada is rapidly passing. In Saskatchewan and Alberta it is only a matter of a short time until all districts will, by means of irrigation or through modern methods of soil culture be brought under cultivation. This will not permit of the ranging of large herds. Small landowners, however, are now feeding steers in increasing numbers. An estimate of the cattle they fed in Central and southern Alberta during last winter gives a cattle they fed in Central and southern Alberta during last winter, gives a large increase in numbers, 75 per cent receiving grain ration, 25 per cent hay alone. Experience of these small feeders is that owing to the mildness of the winter, outdoon feeding is more economical than shed feeding, as adopted in the States.
