The annual general meeting of the Northern railway company of Canada was held in the company's office, Brock street, yesterday, Hon. Frank Smith, president, in the chair.

The report showed the gross earnings for the year to have been \$1,379,103 10-100, or 22.377 7/8 cts. per cent.

The working expenses for the year have been \$1,023,377 7/8 cts., or 16.755 9/16 cts. per cent.
