Dixon & Co.: Some of the bull operators who lately loaded up in a rather rash manner have been tumbling over one another in efforts to get hold of some of the paper profits they have been accumulating. The result has been depression throughout the market. The Vanderbilt, of which so much has been heard lately, suddenly disappeared. Reading has been sold freely for the account of Philadelphia people who were earliest in the recent whirl, and Philadelphia houses too have been peddling out other coal stocks. Chicago Gas dividend is acted on to-morrow.
